

Help Protect Our Public Art!

A cleaning guide for local businesses & volunteers

Keeping our public art clean and in good condition doesn't require special skills or fancy equipment. Just follow these simple tips.



Brush off dirt & detritus

You can use an old rag or a softbristled brush.



Wash with plain dish soap

Mix just a little plain dish soap with water and use a soft rag to wash the sculpture & base. You can use a toothbrush to get any hard-to-reach places or scrub stubborn stains.



Rinse with clean water

Doing a final rinse with clean water helps prevent streaks.



NO METAL BRUSHES

Metal brushes or steel wool will scratch the surface and cause lasting damage.



DO NOT USE

Don't use soaps that are scented or bleach-based, as these can cause chemical reactions that will damage the work.



Report Damage

If you notice cracks or signs of damage on a piece of art, you can report it to the Commission through Report an Issue on the city website.
